WASHINGTON TRAILS ASSOCIATION UNHAPPY WITH INTERPRETATION OF NEW LAW

Recently passed House Bill 1382, was, in the WTA's view designed to provide state money to help maintain roadways and trails used by backpackers and hikers. An advisory committee called NOVA, which is associated with the states Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, has proposed implementing regulations which would limit trails being maintained to those in the immediate area of day use areas, campgrounds and trailheads. Apparently WTA believes that this would eliminate the maintenance of trails that lead long distances into the wilderness where people like us tend to go. MONTHLY MEETING MONDAY DECEMBER 8 SWISS AND AUSTRIAN ALPS SLIDE SHOW

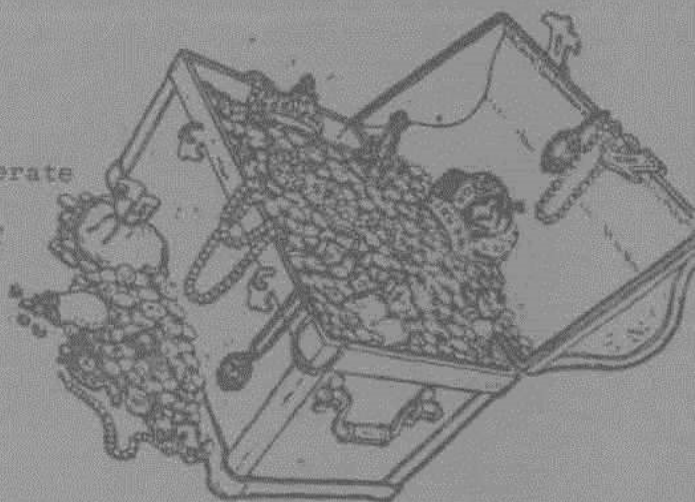
