Harry Wilson, PWC Vice President, would like to see the PWC membership expand while he's an officer of the Club. "There are a lot of people out there that have never heard of us," he says, "hikers who may or may not want to hike with others." Harry would like to see more publicity about the Club get out in the community.

Harry joined PWC about five years ago after seeing mention of it in the newspaper. Although he doesn't go on as many hikes as he would like, he's the primary organizer of two annual clean-up days that are a joint effort between Sierra Club and PWC (Harry is chairman of the Sierra Club for Kitsap, Jefferson, and Clallam Counties). Once a year he leads the effort to clean the Dungeness Spit, and once a year to clean up Shi Shi Beach. At Dungeness they haul

out about 120 large garbage bags of trash; At Shi Shi they helicopter out five large cargo nets full of trash that is both left by hikers and washed ashore from boaters and ships.

Harry lived around the world during his tour in the Navy as a storekeeper in charge of supplies. He's now retired (at 47 years old), single, and has claimed Bremerton as home since 1953.
