#### Hammersley Inlet



# PUGET SOUND PADDLING BASICS

Interested in sea kayaking this year? Got a desire to finally get some of those sea kayaking questions answered or maybe just find out what the questions are? After our long winter, do you find yourself wanting to refresh some of the issues surrounding paddling in the Puget Sound? If you can answer "YES" to any of these questions and are a member of the PWC, then the Puget Sound Paddling Basics course is for you.

The course consists of two evening classroom sessions, a pool session, and two sessions on the water.
